INTRODUCTION

Because the peace loving people of the Canadian Province of Acadia refused to swear allegiance to the British crown, they were subjected to cruel and most unusual punishments. Their crops were destroyed, their cattle were slaughtered, their homes were burned and the people were driven aboard ships by British bayonets and scattered among the English colonists along the Atlantic coast. This act of barbarism is known in history as the Exile of the Acadians. (See Longfellow's Evangeline.) It took place in 1755, the year that Braddock was defeated by the French and Indians.

A baby girl named Elizabeth Boudreau was born to one of these exiled families. At the age of eighteen she eloped and became the wife of Joseph Corporon. The late Oliver Dodge of Chicago was their grandson.

THE GAUDET LETTER

The above mentioned Oliver Dodge, desiring details of the life if his grandfather, Joseph Corporon, journeyed to Ottawa, Canada, in about 1893, and made inquiry of Placide P. Gaudet of 140 Nicholas Street. Mr. Gaudet who was a Notary Public and Keeper of Public Records wrote out and delivered to Mr. Dodge a unique and interesting account of Joseph's love and elopement. The following "Corporon Romance" is a re-write of the Gaudet letter.

A CORPORON ROMANCE

An Acadian named Claude Boudreau (the Boudrecius of Clare are known under the nickname of Sacos) married Judith Laudry on Dec. 1, 1747 in their native village of Grand Pre. When the Acadians were exiled, Claude and Judith and their little children were cast ashore somewhere on Massachusetts Bay in New England. It was here that their daughter, Marguerite, was born on April 11, 1757. In attempting to work their way back to Acadia by slow and painful stages, the family settled at Saco Bay, Maine, where circumstances compelled them to spend several years. It was here that several of their children were born and among them was Elizabeth Boudreau whose birthday was Oct. 13, 1760. Sometime after 1770, the family succeeded in reaching Acadia. They

made their home at Church Point, Clare, Digby County, where also you lived Marguerite and her husband, Louis Thibeau.

Eustache Corporon, a native of Alsace Lorraine, France lived at Tusket Wedge. He had married Angelique Viger (called Brigeau). Their oldest child was Joseph Corporon, born about 1754.

This Joseph Corporon in the fall of 1779 sailed his fishing boat to Church Point and spent some days as a guest at the Louis Thibeau home. Here he met and fell in love with Elizabeth Boudreau, Mrs. Thibeau's sister. Elizabeth's parents objected and she was forbidden to go again to her sister's home. Then it was she asked permission to go lobster hunting and her mother reluctantly consented. But instead of going toward the shore, she went to the home of one Cassimere Le Blanc where Joseph awaited her.

In those days there was no resident priest in Clare or in Argyle. Acadians wishing to be married would pledge themselves before witnesses. Father J. M. Bourge in 1774 had appointed a person in each locality to receive these pledges. By right of such appointment, Cassimere Le Blanc united in marriage Joseph Corporon and Elizabeth Boudreau on Oct. 20, 1779. At the same time and place, Sylvain Pothier, a boy from Joseph's home town of Tusket Wedge, was married to Elizabeth Le Blanc.

At once, Joseph and his bride set sail in their fishing boat for Tusket Wedge and arrived there at the same time as did the other newly weds. Several were on hand to welcome the Pothiers. Among them was Eustache Corporon who knew nothing of his son's marriage. When Joseph introduced his wife, Eutache said mournfully:

"Look at Sylvain Pothier! He comes back with a crown of blessedness while you arrive with a crown of ill luck."

Persons married before witnesses were required to be remarried in accordance with the rites of the Roman Catholic Church on the next visit of the Missionary Priest. When Father Bourge next visited Yarmouth County in 1781, he met couples at Eel Brook where the ceremonies were made complete and marriage certificates issued. As late as 1893, the Pothier certificate was still on file. The document ends with these words in French:

"Marries faute de priestre en presence de temorris le viergt Octobre lau mil sept septante neuf." (For want of a priest, married before witnesses on Oct. 20, 1779.)

Joseph and Elizabeth Corporon were remarried on August 23, 1781 but their certificate has passed out of knowlege.

On March 15, 1786, Joseph sold his land at Tusket Wedge, (at a place then called Mabichidarguene) to Armand Pothier, Sylvain's brother, and moved to Bear Cove on St. Mary's Bay between Metegan and Salmon River. He was the father of eleven children. It is said that he never otherwise prospered. That crown of ill luck!

THE CORPORON NAME

The name, Corporon, has various spellings. It appears as Coperon in a book that names the families living in Grand Pre when that village was burned by the British. A book in the University of Missouri library says that Corpron or Corperon come from a French word "corpierre-on" meaning court of Peter, and the name comes out of the middle ages and from the province of Puy de Dome in central France.

A college teacher of French says that "cor-pierreon" is probably a varient of "coeur-pieu-on." "Coeur" is heart and "pieu" is stake. He adds that the name looks like "heart-impaler"—one of those knighthood threat names.

THE SAD FATE OF THE ACADIANS

Among the poems which tell a story, "Evangeline" ranks high. The poet, Longfellow tells about a young Acadian woman named Evangeline who was parted from Gabriel, the man she loved.

While trying to locate Gabriel, Evangeline traveled down the Mississippi River. At last she gave up the search and became a nun. Many years later she found Gabriel, but he was ill and died soon afterward.

That is a sad story, and it leaves the reader with a feeling of sorrow. We wonder how such a thing as the movement of Acadians could have happened. Evangelline is a character of fiction, but certain facts laid the basis for the fiction. There really was an Acadia, and a change of owners took place at the time Evangeline is supposed to have lived there.

Going further back, we find a contest for North America, with Great Britain, France and Spain as the leading nations seeking the continent. During that contest, there was a New Spain, also a New England and a New France.

English English vessels under the Cabots :xplored the coasts of Nova Scotia and Labrador and Great Britain laid a broad claim to land now in Canada. The French came long after the Cabots, but they started colonies in Canada before British settlers arrived.

Scottish and English families followed the French across the Atlantic and built homes in the land which the French called Acadie, or Acadia. That land was given the name of Nova Scotia by a British King.

There were wars between the French and British, and Acadia or Nova Scotia changed hands time and again. The French settlers, known as Acadians, took part in several battles, but usually spent their days in raising crops and taking care of cattle.

Two centrules ago, the British gained in the struggle for Acadia, They told the French settlers that they must take an oath to be loyal to Great Britain. Most of the Acadians replied that they never would accept such an oath and were ordered deported. Sailing vessels carried about 6000 of them to Louisiana and other places. They were allowed to take away their money and household goods.

I beg leave to say that Joseph Corpornn, your great grandfatter, was born about the year 1754. He was the eldest son of Eustache Corporn and Agelique Viger called Brigeau. In the fall of 1779, he left Tusket Wedge, in a fishing boat and went to Church point, Clare, Digby County and there, for several days, he was the guest of Louis Thibeau whose wife's maiden name was Marguarite Boudreau, born in New England, April 11, 1757 of the Lawful marriage of Claude Boudreau and Judith Laudry, both natives of Grand Pre, when they were married December 1, 1747.

The Boudrecius of Clare are known under the nickname of Sacos. At the expulsion of the Acadians in the fall of 1755, Claude Boudreau and his wife and family were transported to Massachusetts Bay, whence they went to Saco Bay, Maine, where they lived for several years. After 1770 they left that place for St. Mary's Bay and settled at Church Point. Several of their children were born at Saco Bay; amongst them was Elizabeth, on the 13 of October, 1760. This is the person that Joseph Corporon married on the 20th of October, 1779. As you see she was a minor and moreover, there is an elopement in this case, the first one that ever took place in Clare.

In those early days, there was no resident priest in Clare nor in Argyle; and therefore those amongst the Acadians who wanted to be united in matrimony had no other means than to pledge each other before witnesses. In each locality a person had been appointed by Father J. M. Bourg, in 1774, to receive the mutual consent of the parties who wished to be married. The one who held this office at Church Point was Cassimere Le Blanc; and it is before him that Joseph Corporon and Elizabeth Boudreau were united in matrimony. It is a well known fact in Clare that this marriage took place at the same time as that of Sylvain Pothier of Tucket Wedge to Elizabeth La Blanc of Church Point.

The persons thus married before witnesses were obliged on the next visit of the missionary priest to have their marriage performed in accordance with the rites of the Roman Catholic Church. Father Bourg's first visit in Yarmouth county was in August, 17bl and those who had been married previously, before witnesses, went to Eel Brook to be re-married by him. A certificate of such performance was given by the priest, to each couple. In 1893, I have taken from the original a copy of the marriage of Sylvain Pothier and Elizabeth Le Blanc, and it ends thus; "Marries faute de prietre en presence de temorris le viregt Octobre lau mil sept septante neuf," (for want of a priest, married before witnesses on the 20th of October in the year 1779).

Joseph Corporon and Elizabeth Boudreau were re-married on the 23rd of August, 1781 and a certificate was given to them also, but what became of it I have no knowledge.

After this long explanation, let us come to the last elopement. As already said, Joseph Corporon was staying at Louis Thibeau's house at Church Point. There he met his future wife, who was visiting her sister almost daily. As a mutual consequence, Joseph Corporon and Elizabeth Boudreau fell in love and wanted to be married; but the young girl's mother objected to this and forbade her daughter to go to Thibeau's house. The two lovers were bound to be united in matrimony against the will of the girl's parents and arrangements were made accordingly.

On the 20th of October, Elizabeth Boudreau asked her mother's permission to go fishing lobsters at the shore. At first the mother refused, but at last gave consent. Instead of going to the shore, Elizabeth went directly to Cassimire LeBlanc's house where Joseph Corporon was waiting for her, and they were immediately married.

No sooner was the ceremony performed, than they made for the shore and went at once on board of Joseph Corporon's boat and sailed off for Tusket Wedge, where they arrived at the same time that Sylvain Pothier and his bride did. There were several people at the shore to welcome Pothier and his wife, among whom were Eustache Corporon, Joseph's father who knew nothing of his son's marriage. When Joseph introduced his wife to his father, the latter answered mournfully, "look at Sylvain Pothier, he comes back with a crown of blessedness while you arrive with a crown of ill luck". And so it was, for Joseph Corporon never prospered.

On the 15th of March, 1786, he sold the lot of land he owned at Tusket Wedge at a place called then, Mabichidarguene, to Armand Pothier, Sylvain's brother, and removed to Bear Cove on St. Mary's Bay between Meteghan and Salmon River.

Gaines Corporon was born May 8th 1849 in Linn Co. Towa and departed this life on February wO, 1927 at his home in Osborne, Kansas, age 77. He enlisted in Co. H. 6th Iowa Cavalry, August 1, 1863 being but 14 years old. He was captured by the South in July 1864 and served in both the Florence and Andersonville prisons. He with others made their escape on February 22, 1865 just 62 years ago today. Hr. Corporon often mentioned this event as being the greatest in his Tife and expressed the desire to celebrate it accordingly. His soul today has escaped the prison house of pain and suffering. He was honorably discharged on June 10, 1865.

He was married to Susan Guffey on January 4, 1866 and these honored citizens celebrated their 61st wedding anniversary, January 4th 1927. It was sixty-one years of toiling together, pioneering and rearing a large family of honorable citizens, but as Mrs. Corporon expressed, it, 61 years of happiness together.
